About Hawaii 3R's

Hawaii 3R's is a 501(c)3, tax-exempt organization founded in 2001 by the late U.S. Senator Daniel K. Inouye to help the HIDOE with their repair and maintenance backlog. The program is loosely based on America's Promise to foster "sweat equity" by a broad base of volunteers for different projects, including students and administrators from the respective schools.

CIP Funded R&M Projects

In 2019, the Hawaii State Legislature appropriated \$10 million in CIP funds to Hawaii 3R's to address the growing list of backlogged repair and maintenance projects in Hawaii's public schools. The funds were transferred from the Hawaii Department of Education (HIDOE) to Hawaii 3R's on February 21, 2020. R&M work on Maui and Oahu began the following week. Within two weeks, COVID-19 shut the state down but fortunately, did not affect the R&M projects that were either in progress or scheduled to commence on Oahu and Maui. In some small way these repair projects may have helped to keep people on the job during the unprecedented global pandemic which resulted in unforeseen economic impacts: job losses, mass unemployment, long food lines, interruptions to supply lines, etc.

A "sweat equity" component using volunteers from the schools and the broader community is built into the Hawaii 3R's program, where appropriate, as a way to foster community engagement with Hawaii's public schools. Volunteers also help in keeping project costs down. Hawaii 3R's works closely with HIDOE on all projects, and therefore, all HIDOE codes and standards are met. Completed projects are confidently accepted by the Facilities Branch

of HIDOE. Note that during the pandemic, restrictions on group gatherings made it impossible to build volunteer partnerships into any of the scheduled projects. This trend will likely continue into 2021 as we finish the remaining R&M work under this special CIP program.

While the HIDOE Facilities Branch in Honolulu oversees repair and maintenance of all public schools across the state, the state Dept. of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) on the neighbor islands is tasked with the actual R&M of public schools on their respective islands.

Of note, Oahu and Maui completed nearly all of their R&M projects before year end 2020. Hawaii Island is about 75 percent complete with their work as of January 2021. The county of Kauai got off to a late start because of confusion on the county's mandate regarding the COVID-19 shutdown. HIDOE administrators on Kauai initially would not grant permission to contractors to enter their campuses to scope the projects. The hope is to accelerate the work planned for Kauai in 2021.

As of January 1, 2021, a total of 70 projects in the state have been completed or are nearing completion at a total cost of \$9,132,772.06 and an estimated savings of over \$3 million. Additionally, 21 playground projects across the state are in progress on every island and represent a savings to the state of over \$1 million.

PLAYGROUND PROJECTS ACROSS THE STATE

\$1.2M



Due to years of budget cuts within HIDOE, the backlog for playgrounds at many school campuses suffered greatly. To highlight the severity of the backlog, a short video by teachers and students at Keonepoko Elementary on Hawaii Island aired on Hawaii News Now on November 13, 2019. Their new and long-awaited playground is included in this year's CIP program and will be completed this year.

Some schools manage to fundraise toward the cost of new playground equipment which is typically a high-ticket item both in terms of cost for manufacturing and shipping. Safety standards for playgrounds are also high. And because of Hawaii's climate, product durability that can endure Hawaii's salt air is also a major concern. Most of the equipment purchased by the HIDOE is manufactured in Europe because of product durability, and therefore, playground projects also require more lead time and planning. Through this year's CIP program, the state realizes a cost savings of about \$1.2 million for 21 playgrounds.

Transition Centers



HELPED TO DEVELOP
NEW OR IMPROVE EXISTING
TRANSITION CENTERS

Under a four-year, \$1 million contract with the HIDOE, Hawaii 3Rs has assisted a total of 51 public schools across the state in developing new or improving existing transition centers for students.

Transition Centers began largely at public schools that serve a student population of military dependents such as Leilehua High School and Radford High School. Transition centers exist to support students, particularly those who are new to the state, adjust to a new school environment and campus. Under the current contract, the definition for transition centers was expanded to include public schools that serve large transient populations and not just military dependents. This is not a "one size fits all" program. Decisions on how best to address the needs of students was left entirely to each school.

For the 2020-2021 school year, eleven schools were approved for transition center funding and most projects are in progress or completed. By mutual consent between HIDOE and Hawaii 3R's, this contract will expire in June 2021.

Although the majority of schools who applied for transition center funding are situated on the island of Oahu, six neighbor island schools applied for and received funding as well.
